You have the right to receive a "Good Faith Estimate" explaining how much your medical care will cost.

Under the law, health care providers need to give patients who do not have insurance or who are not using insurance an estimate of the expected charges for medical services.

You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate for the total expected cost of any non-emergency healthcare services. This includes related cost like medical procedures, tests, prescription drugs, equipment.

You can ask your health care provider, and any other provider you choose, for a Good Faith Estimate before you schedule a service. You should receive your Good Faith Estimate at least one (1) business day before your schedule a medical service or item.

If you receive a bill that is at least \$400 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill. Make sure to save a copy or picture of your Good Faith Estimate.
